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President's Piece

Philippa Doyle gave us a great tour of India and not just fabrics. Her introduction covered colour, architecture and people which helped give us an insight into the country. Philippa's collection of antique fabrics showed the care the makers took as well as frugality in enlarging a child's outfit as they grew. I have tried sewing a round shisha mirror onto fabric and it wasn't easy, so it makes sense to keep reusing those fabrics as much as possible. Our current emphasis on reuse and recycling is not new.

The emphasis on reuse continues in this month's 'block of the month' and an opportunity to use up those crumbs or tiny scraps. For those who were not at the meeting, the instructions have already been sent out. In case you were wondering, there is a reference to GQ in the instructions which is 'gift quilts'. Thanks to Alison for designing recent blocks which has helped to use some of our gift quit fabric. The more quilts we make the more we can donate to the Women's Refuge at the end of the year.

Our next monthly meeting will be our workday. Bring your project(s), these can be for hand or machine sewing and join us for as long as you like between 10.30am and 3 to 3.30pm. We will provide tea and coffee, irons and ironing boards and some electrical cables.

If you are going to Symposium you will need to get your machine electrically tested and tagged. We have an electrician coming to the workday at 11am so bring your machine down or get someone else to bring it for you. If there are 10 people getting the machines tested the cost will be about \$14-15 per machine.

Retreats

She convinced me to join up and I attended a couple of meetings and read about the retreat. I wasn't quite sure what to expect at a quilting retreat, but I like quilting and I like retreats, so it seemed a no brainer. I turned up at 2pm when it was said to start and found a hive of activity already going on, with rooms chosen and retreatants well set up at tables and into their projects; note to self – next time get there early!

I was quickly given a table, set up my machine and happily got stuck into a project that had stalled for a while. It was lovely to wander about the other tables to meet other mad quilters and see what they were up

too. It was also nice to have people come by my table and admire my project. I am also a photography addict (my other passion) and take a photo every day — have done so for the past 14 years. I didn't have one in the bag yet and was so excited when we were visited by one of the resident cats, Lily (I am also a crazy cat lady!). Lisa was very helpful in setting up her project to lie over the ironing board so I could capture some photos of her in front of it. Janine and Di enjoyed meeting her as well. Lily's companion Midnight (all black) hung around with her as well but was not quite as social.



A few of us were booked into a local Indian restaurant for dinner which was lovely and a good way to meet people I didn't know. Mum could only attend on the Saturday and I only knew Lisa out of all the retreatants. The others decided to get fish and chips together back at the retreat. We all carried on sewing into the night, with the last of us finishing around 10.30pm. After a nice snooze, I came back firing on all cylinders rearing to finish my project. It was so nice being able to sew and chat all together. As Saturday afternoon led into happy hour, we had quite the interesting chat going on.....

If you see a book you think would interest CQ members, have a chat to Maree, our Librarian.



20 July	Komebukuro Bag (Rice Bag) – Clare Smith	Learn how to do 'One Stitch Sashiko' and turn your stitching into a Komebukuro bag (rice bag). Participants will explore a range of different one stitch sashiko stitches in class then complete the panels at home ready to return and complete the bag construction in a second class. The stitched panels could also be used to make pincushions and these are quick to make and make great gifts.	BagCl
17 August	Bear Paws – Di Barnden	Small Lap Quilt can be made with one colour or several. Go hunting in your stash to see what gems you can uncover.	BearP s
21 Septe mber	Christmas Stocking – Cherie Gurney	Have a day of creative fun making your very own Christmas stocking. Choose from either the Black Christmas Tree Stocking kit or the Gold and Silver Stars Kit (included in the kit is a prequilted Christmas stocking, embroidery floss, tape and cord). You will learn how to paint fabric, handstitch text and join all the components together by machine stitching to finish off. Fabric paint and paint brush supplied by tutor. 
This year's sale will be held Sunday 19 May from 10am to 2pm. The approximate size of the tables is $1.6m \times .8m$. The cost per table is \$35.





Gift Quilt BOM April – short version

Create a piece of Crumb fabric from your scraps that measures 3 % x 10 % inches.

Tip: A suggestion is to press your seams open when making your Crumb fabric.

Outside Fabric (We're going with a green colour theme)

Cut: - Two strips 2 ½ x 10 ½ inches

- Two strips 2 ½ x 7 ½ inches.

Sew the $2 \% \times 10 \%$ inch strips to the long sides of your Crumb fabric. Press the seams away from the crumb fabric. Next sew the $2 \% \times 7 \%$ strips to the ends of your Crumb fabric. Press seams away from the Crumb fabric. Your block should measure $7 \% \times 14 \%$ inches.

Finished Block - Bring your finished block to the CQ meeting on 8 June.
