Obituary – Beverley Lowe

Beverley died at Kenepuru hospital on the 14th November. She had been unwell for some months and had moved to a rest home in September. Beverley was born in Napier, trained as a dietician at Otago University, then worked in many parts of New Zealand and overseas, including Africa.

I first met Beverley in the early 1980s when she came to my Beginner's Patchwork evening class at Aotea College. She then attended a number of Advanced classes over the years I taught. Not long after starting Patchwork, Beverley started meeting regularly with three other Coastal Quilters Members: Gina Graham (now living in Australia), Ruth Cumming (who died a year ago) and Sheila Hardwick who still attends CQ meetings regularly. They met every week for many years and also attended a number of NZ Symposia over the years, extending their Patchwork techniques by taking classes and seeing the exhibitions. Beverley, Ruth and Sheila all became proficient at needle turn applique and turned out some beautiful quilts. Many were of show quality but sadly Ruth was the only one who entered shows regularly.

Beverley was a Foundation Member of Coastal Quilters and active in the early years, having the job of 'tea lady' for a number of years.

We are grateful to have been gifted her significant 'stash' not long before she died for use in making our gift quilts. I was able to show her some of the Christmas Stockings made from her stash before she died and she was very pleased of see them and that her fabric was of use.

Gift Quilts Wrap Up - 2024

Another productive year with our Gift Quilts has come to a close with the donation of 37 quilts, many Christmas socks, and several table runners to Whare Manaaki Women's Refuge and Te Whare Tiaki Wāhine Refuge.

Prue and I gifted to the Refuges on 29 November. We were able to have a good chat to Gemma and Sue, the contacts for both organisations, about the work that they do, and how our quilts and donations are used.

They were excited to have a recently refurbished whare for women and families who need emergency accommodation. Our quilts will be utilised in this space to bring comfort to families who often come there with nothing.

Other items that are often needed, especially for women, are underwear, socks and toiletries including hairbrushes, shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste & Dush and deodorant. So, if you find you get too many gifts of 'socks and smellies' at Christmas, there is a place you can donate your surplus to.

Thank you to all our members of Coastal Quilters for your part in making our Gift Quilts. We all play a part whether it is physically sewing, donations of completed quilts, fabric, thread, and time, or supporting our sales and raffles at Club meetings which help provide for things like batting and labels. It is the efforts of many that contribute to our gift of care to part of our community. It also connects us as a group of likeminded creators with a common purpose.

Thank you again for your mahi this year. 2025 will be another year of Gift Quilt creativity!

Hall	Please arrive by 12.45 to help put out chairs in the hall and at the end of meeting help
	stack any unreturned chairs to back of hall.
Kitchen	Simone brings milk, biscuits and cups etc. Prior to start of meeting, you need to put


