Sheila Christensen has been stitching since making all her own clothes as a teenager. Since taking up quilting, she has quickly developed a reputation for her

designs and her helpful and patient teaching style. Sheila has a keen interest in colour and using fabric designs in creative ways, and loves to help quilters take adventurous steps in their quilting.

Sheila was born in the UK and moved to New Zealand in 2002. After a career in business, she studied primary teaching at Victoria University and taught in Masterton and in London. She has been the owner of Quilters' Lane in Masterton since 2011, and she finds her teaching experience very useful in planning and implementing her quilting classes.

Sheila has won awards for her quilts including Shooting Stars, Shifting Strata and Purple Haze. Her Modern Triangle Sampler was juried into Quiltcon in the USA. Every year, Sheila designs a Puzzle Mystery Quilt, which is run as a block of the month from her shop. She has written two books, 'Quilts with an Angle' and 'The Quick and Easy Triangle Block Tool', both published by C&T, and she designs patterns for Creative Grids USA and Benartex fabrics. Sheila also teaches internationally, both in-person and online, and has an online membership called Sheila's Quilt Party www.quiltwithsheila.com.

## Helper Duties (All helpers to arrive by 12.45 pm)

If you are new to helping out with duties, the following is a simple version of what is expected. If you are unable to do your duty please contact a committee person.

Hall	Please arrive by 12.45 to help put out chairs in the hall and at the end of meeting help stack any unreturned chairs to back of hall.

Accepting friend requests makes your account vulnerable to hackers and scammers. It may lead to getting your personal information easily.


Check your privacy settings. Make sure that:

## How to Fold Fabric so it Stacks Neatly

Do you struggle with organizing and storing your fabric? This simple folding technique creates fabric pieces that stack nicely, regardless of how long the cuts are. Each piece of folded fabric is the same width and length, while larger pieces ae thicker than shorter cuts. Once everything is folded, stack colours together for easy selection. And, keep everything for one project together in one stack (so you don't inadvertently use a piece for something else!).
