### About Dr Gillian Green:

In 1959, my parents took me and my siblings to live in Semarang, Indonesia for almost three years, and we spent a lot of time in various batik ateliers across Central Java with our artist mother. In 1997 I was very delighted to return to live in Indonesia, this time in Jakarta when my diplomat husband became the New Zealand Ambassador to the Republic. Over the four wonderful years, I travelled to almost every corner of this fascinating country, talking to the women who created textiles, studying the traditions and processes and ended up with a private collection of almost 300 ikats and batiks. I will talk about the batik process from preparing the cotton cloth to the final wash, and show examples from across the principal batik regions of Indonesia.





I got hooked into the quilting world since 2016, I am self taught through watching YouTube tutorials and going to Quilt Events around NZ and Australia. I am also an avid crocheter, in fact all things crafty. I love a challenge and am inspired daily by what's out there."

#### Judith Havill

As a young child, my grandmother, who was a professional dressmaker, taught me how to sew on her treadle machine (which I still have). I always designed and sewed my own clothes and a lot of my children's clothes.



When my job changed to administering the Community Education programme I would try to take a class each term so it was a natural progression to go to a Patchwork sampler class. It took about three (or more) years to make my sample quilt which I quilted each block with sample quilting. It is a prize possession of one of my daughters. So I then had to make more quilts for my other child and so I became hooked. I was able to encourage a number of different tutors to take classes at college (mainly so I too could take the class). Now most of my quilts are gifts for grandchildren and friends.

### Moira Butterfield

I have been coming to Coastal Quilters for several years, (cant remember how long but recently began to finish the sampler quilt which was a project from the Club in 2015/16), so thought it was time I put my hand up and joined the Committee.

I started sewing at Intermediate, (treadle machine making the obligatory apron and cap), and sewed clothes for myself, off and on as a teenager, but not many as I was never very happy with the results. I sewed for my daughters when they were young and then mostly repaired clothes.



When my eldest daughter was 18, she wanted to learn quilting at Tawa College with

Judith Pinney and she asked if I would go with her, so my first quilt was a single bed sampler quilt, made for my younger daughter, which did get finished, with Gemma doing some of the blocks for me. I had admired quilts of the years but never had the confidence in my sewing to tackle them. A few years later I met Marilyn Holland and we bonded over wine and embroidery. Marilyn is a quilter of many years and she helped me along, and I started buying fabric, I lay the blame for a wardrobe full of fabric at her feet, it's all her fault!!

Since then my sewing skills have improved somewhat, and I have made quilts for extended family. This year is the year for finishing quilts that are lurking under the cutting table, mind you last year was also a 'finishing year' progress is slow but steady.



















