### **Helper Duties**

If you are new to helping out with duties, the following is a simple version of what is expected.

Hall	Please arrive by 12.45 to help put out chairs in the hall and at the end of meeting help stack any unreturned chairs to back of hall.

We are asking for volunteers – if you have something you would like to share with others, please feel free to talk with one of our committee.


It's great to have some variety and something different from last year. It's been amazing the ideas/tips that have been shared.
