Looking forward to our next Silverstream Retreat, keep these dates free 5-7 September 2025.














# **Helper Duties**

Hall	Please arrive by 12.45 to help put out chairs in the hall and at the end of meeting help stack any unreturned chairs to back of hall.






# **Show and Tell**


















Hannie's from Chris Jurd's Symposium class and bear paw from Di's class



Have you ever wanted to ensure you get a good fold when wrapping or just tying a bow around a quilt. You can even stick a card in the front flap. Check this out:

- Lay your quilt face down
- Fold up a little less than a third of your quilt
- Fold over again and you should still see about 4 inches of backing
- Flip it around
- Fold the 4 inches backing flap up
- Flip it around and fold a third of the quilt over
- Fold over the other third
- Lift that last fold and you will see a little pocket
- Shove the other side in there And that's it super easy and your quilt wont unfold. (PS I haven't tried it yet Lindy)
